# from the hazzan's study

Shavuot is the celebration of the Revelation at Sinai. *"Atah nigleita ba'anan kvod'kha* - You were revealed in a cloud of glory." God, and the Law were revealed at Sinai. They were not the only things revealed at Sinai.

Moses was there, and we were there. Here's what was revealed: in the presence of God, we were afraid. Given the chance to hear God, we chose to have someone else be our emissary. And when we thought God was not present, we built an idol and prayed to a false god. We turned away from our emissary, Moses, and from our God. We had no faith, no loyalty, no strength in our convictions. The experience at Sinai revealed a people who would embarrass their God, a people who were slaves to their fear.

And what was revealed of Moses? He had the bravery to stand before God, to speak, to advocate for the people, but he also was consumed by his anger and threw down the tablets - the tablets with the word of God! But most troubling, what was revealed at Sinai was God's wrath and a God who chose not to pardon the sins of the people. Is it possible to think of Sinai and not weep? Is it possible to want to return? Is it possible to want God to reveal more?

The Revelation at Sinai teaches us that we can't stop at one point in history and determine that all has been revealed.

If God had given us the Ten Commandments - *dayeinu*? No. It would not have been enough. The truth is that the Torah is not enough. The Talmud is not enough. We've only seen a small piece of what this world is about and I pray that Revelation may continue, because I have yet to understand the Law, and God.



Shavuot is a time for celebrating the Revelations at Sinai. Celebrate the Torah. Celebrate the truth of who we were and who we are now. Celebrate the fact that we are not static. Celebrate the idea that what was written in stone could be broken and rewritten. Celebrate the idea that we are not done learning and not done revealing and being revealed.

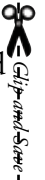

### Teachers as Students

What do Polsky Religious School teachers do when they are not planning their lessons or teaching our children? Three of our teachers, Debby Agron, Dayna Gershon and Jill Goldstein spend their out-of-school time learning. They are members of a cadre of teachers in the community that participate in a program called the *Teacher Education Initiative*, which is funded by the Jewish Community Foundation, Jewish Federation, Jewish Heritage Foundation and Menorah Legacy Foundation. The program commitment is for intensive professional development for the teachers in the cadre and ongoing support for the other teachers on our faculty.

Our three teachers participate in monthly seminars and have a monthly visit and observation by one of the facilitators of the program. This is part of the community commitment to religious school teachers to increase their Judaic knowledge, acquire and hone classroom skills and feel greater professional satisfaction. It is anticipated that students in the school will benefit from everything these teachers are learning and transmitting to the rest of the faculty. We are appreciative of the sponsors of this program and have already seen some of the benefits in our classrooms. We look forward to their continued participation in this unique learning opportunity.

We thank Fred Bodker and his team of officers: Jeff Katz, Diane Azorsky, Mike Abrams, Kurt Kavanaugh and Rita Cortés, for the considerable time and effort they spent over the past two years providing leadership to our congregation. This has been an extremely difficult time in our synagogue's history, and the officers have made tremendous sacrifices at home and at work to properly support Beth Shalom.

When Beth Shalom's Bylaws were revised in 2003, there was a concerted effort to elect younger members to the Board of Directors. Since Board membership is a criteria prior to being elected to office, we now have the youngest set of officers in the history of our congregation. This has created a new problem.

Generally, young people are extremely busy raising their families and establishing their careers. Our current officers needed to seriously impact their work and family time to properly lead our synagogue. Unfortunately, this has forced four of our officers to decide they cannot continue in their leadership roles.

As a congregation, we need to make some major changes. A Bylaws Review Committee has been established, and is looking at revising the governance structure of our congregation. We need to have Board members and committee chairs take on more responsibility. And finally, we need to get more middle-aged members of our congregation, who are in a different stage in their life-cycle, to assume synagogue leadership responsibilities.



Members of Beth Shalom fill many leadership positions in the Kansas City Jewish community. We need to get several of you to come back home, and provide some of that leadership for our congregation!

## Keruv Corner – *Standing at Sinai*

Shavuot, the time of the giving of the Torah, will be celebrated May 19 and 20 (the 6 & 7 of Sivan). As I reflect on this formative moment, there are many Torah verses that resonate for me. One is from *Deuteronomy 29* in *Parashat Nitzavim* where we are taught that everyone stood at Sinai. The inclusiveness of the language and numerous examples sighted emphasize the importance of drawing near ("Keruv") even those who are not Jewish but have cast their lot with our people through marriage or other means of association. These people have indicated a desire to be within the broad framework of the Jewish world and to be counted as part of our community.

Keruv at Beth Shalom is reaching out to all who wish to identify with the Jewish community and enable them, within the parameters of Conservative Judaism, to find a place in Jewish life. Shavuot has traditionally been the time to honor those who have formalized their association by calling them to the Torah. It should also be the time to offer an appropriate welcome to those who have less formally cast their lot with us—to devise an appropriate ritual that gives them a sense that they are indeed welcome to join with us for we are all standing at Sinai to hear God's word. Their presence as part of our community from that moment at Sinai until now is to be celebrated.
