From the Rabbi's Study

The Choice to Rejoice!



We can't always choose whether or not we are going to be happy, but we can choose whether or not we are going to celebrate.

To celebrate, to rejoice, to sing, to dance – these are choices we can make that will actually affect our state of happiness. “Being happy” is a passive state of being, “celebrating” is a conscious choice about how to view and interact with the world.

The reason I love Sukkot and Simchat Torah is we get to choose to celebrate the divine gifts in our life. Sukkot celebrates the earth's natural abundance. It also celebrates the ingathering of the Jewish people.



Simchat Torah celebrates the public reading of the Torah which we both complete and begin again on this day.

Many people often mistake Judaism's mitzvot and see its “do's” and “don't's,” as a limited existence that minimizes personal choice and autonomy. Nothing could be further from the truth. By having these holidays on the calendar, we get to choose how we are going to celebrate together as a community. Had these holidays not been there – our choices would be limited, not expanded.

I have never in my life seen someone frown when they shake a lulav and etrog. I have also never seen somebody frown when dancing



while holding a Torah scroll. These are actions that inspire happiness in ourselves. Perhaps it is the spirituality; perhaps it is the silliness of it all. Either way – does it matter?

So, I invite you – make a choice this fall. Choose to celebrate. Choose to enjoy your Judaism. Choose to be with one another. Don't do it out of obligation, but because you choose to.

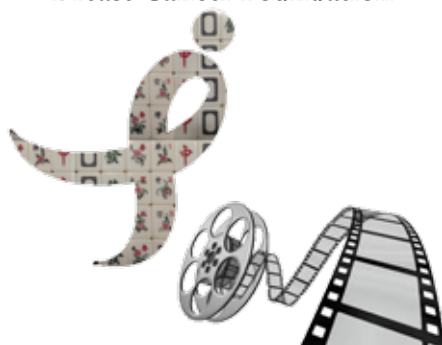

Two of my strongest memories are the smell and sound of the autumn leaves, especially those that made up the schach, the roof of our Sukkah, and the utter joy of receiving a bag of candy from the Sisterhood of Congregation B'nai Abraham, my childhood shul in Butler, PA. One of my goals as Director of Congregational Learning is to impart to all the children of our synagogue the joy of

community Judaism that I grew up with. To that end, there are two programs I would like to highlight now: Kehillah (community-wide) Sukkah Decorating Party for kindergartners through second graders, and Candy for the Kids on Erev Simchat Torah.

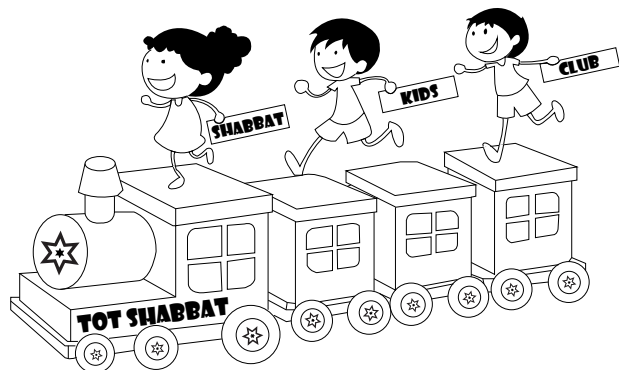
