From the Rabbi's Study



Continuing the Transition

As I look back on my Scroll messages of this year, there is a common denominator—that of continuity and transition. Now, as I write one of my last messages, I want to once again emphasize this theme.

At this time, Beth Shalom like the Israelites of the Torah, looks forward to the future. For our ancestors, now well into the Wilderness Experience, Moshe's leadership, although tested, was at its peak. Yet because, we reread the narrative annually, we know that the mantle will soon be passed to Yehoshua who represented new ideas and younger leadership. There will be a smooth transition, and the people will grow in strength. Indeed, in the first chapter of the Book of Joshua, the new leader assures the people that God will be with them as God was with Moshe. Yehoshua states (1:6): "Be strong and resolute".

These are transition moments for Beth Shalom. The interview process for Senior Rabbi has begun. A new rabbi will emerge to guide Beth Shalom into its strong and promising

future. That transition will be smooth. Our congregation has done this before when it transitioned from Rabbi Hadas to Rabbi Margolies and from Rabbi Margolies to me. This period has covered over 80 years—what Pirke Avot tells us is the age of strength ("ben shemonim ligvurah").

We know that a synagogue is more than the rabbi who leads and guides. It is the core of the membership who takes an active role in the shaping of its daily life and the future. Although I do not see myself as Yehoshua, I will echo his charge when I say: "Be strong and resolute". The path will not always be without challenges, but with the core strength that you as a congregation have and the collaborative efforts you undertake, Beth Shalom will continue to go from "strength to strength".

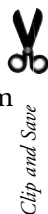

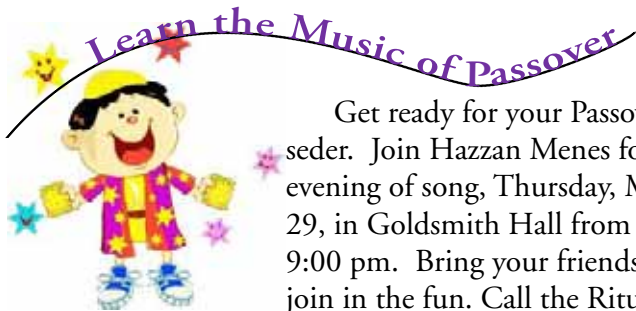

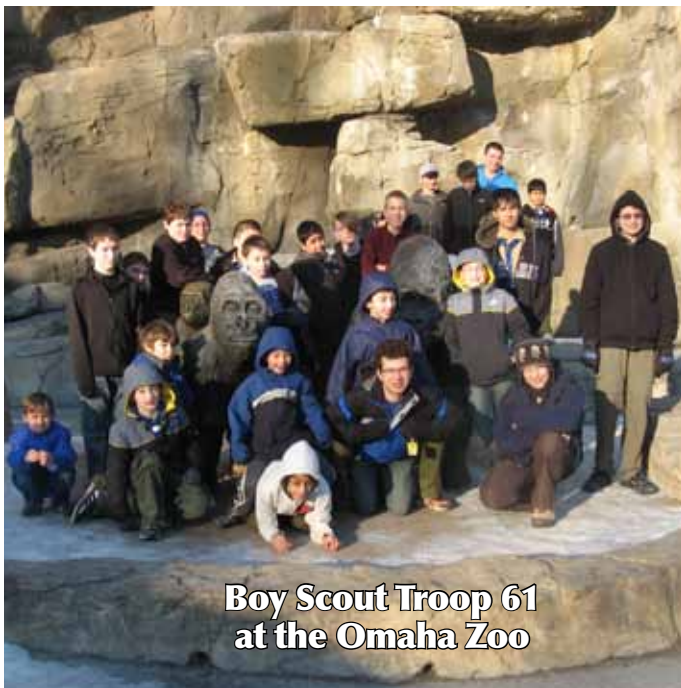
A new case to display the Congregation's beautiful collec-

On Sunday, March 25th at 10:30 am, the Polsky Religious School will hold its annual Kindergarten Round Up for the 2012-13 school year.

How important is starting your child in religious school in kindergarten? PRS believes it is very important to start children as early as possible in a "formal" religious school program so they can maintain already established friendships begun in a Jewish preschool and continue to learn in a positive Jewish way.



What should you look for in a good school? Consider the environment. Are the people there friendly? Do the children look happy? Are they actively engaged in age appropriate activities? Does the school have goals and a curriculum with a scope and sequence to what is being taught? Does the school reflect values and learning that are important to you as a family? Is there a sense of community and a feeling of belonging?

These are all very important questions and should be addressed when looking at any school for your child. We look forward to meeting with prospective kindergarten families and fully addressing their questions and concerns. Please tell families whose children are not attending religious school about our nationally-recognized program.

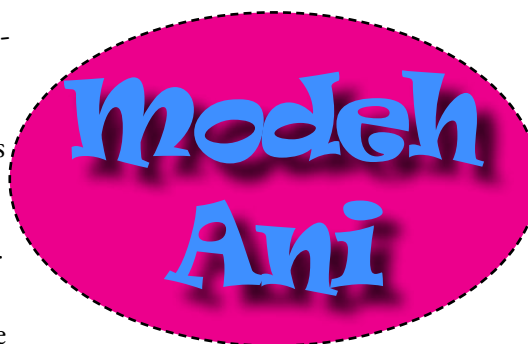

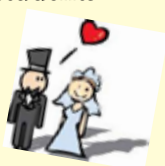

Mock Wedding for 6th Graders

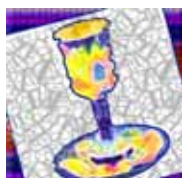

Passover Apples and Honey (Charoset)

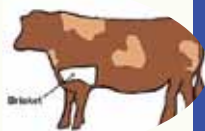
Ingredients

- 1/4 cup ground cinnamon, or to taste
- 5 cups apples - peeled, cored and chopped
- 2 cups grape juice or wine
- 1 cup chopped walnuts

Directions

1. In a bowl, mix the honey, cinnamon, apples, grape juice or wine and walnuts together until thoroughly combined.

Very Best Brisket Original Recipe Yield 14 servings **Kosher for Passover Brisket**



Ingredients

- 4 onions, sliced
- 1 pound small new potatoes
- 1 (16 ounce) package baby carrots
- 7 pounds beef brisket
- 1 cup beef broth
- 1 packet dry onion soup mix
- 1 cup ketchup
- 10 fluid oz. Passover Coca Cola

Directions

1. Layer the onions, potatoes, and carrots into the bottom of a large Dutch oven. Place the brisket on top of the vegetables.
2. Mix the beef broth, onion soup mix, ketchup, and Coca Cola in a bowl, and pour it over the brisket and vegetables. Bring to a boil over high heat, cover, and reduce heat to a simmer.
3. Simmer the brisket until tender, about 2 1/2 hours.
