## Birthdays are Days of Celebration – and Reflection

Passover doesn't need to be the only Jewish holiday of questions and stories. Let this 70th birthday be not only one of celebration – but also one of reflection. Let it be a day where we not only look up to Israel or look down at Israel, let it also be a day where we look inward at ourselves as well. Let us recognize that this significant birthday also affects us.

This month marks a big birthday for the State of Israel. From Wednesday night, April 18th to sunset on Thursday night, April 19th, Jews around the world will celebrate Yom HaAtzmaut. This day marks 70 years since David Ben-Gurion read aloud the Declaration of the State of Israel and Kansas City's own President Truman recognized the Jewish State.

Pirkei Avot teaches that “At age 70, a person reaches the age of a hoary head.” A hoary head is an archaic way of saying a grey-haired head of wisdom. Though 70 is young for a country – for the beginning of a radically renewed nation-state like Israel, it is not so young. After all, the Soviet Union only lasted 69 years. Czechoslovakia only lasted for 75 years. It was fifty years from the time that Herzl saw the Dreyfus trial until Ben-Gurion announced the State.

Jews in Israel and around the world are missing an opportunity if we look at Yom HaAtzmaut as only a party. If we only see it as a time to play old Israeli folk tunes and eat falafel together we are missing the chance to ask ourselves the big questions about Jewish sovereignty.

In some Jewish communities, it is customary on one's birthday to learn the passage from Genesis where God asks Adam: “Where are you?” On Israel's 70th Birthday,

we are missing an opportunity if we don't ask ourselves some big questions about where we are on this birthday.

Here are a few to start with:

We can ask ourselves how can the technological and scientific innovations that Israel is making improve the rest of the world?

We can ask ourselves: when we have been praying for a return to Israel for 2,000 years – what does it mean that non-Orthodox Jews have never embraced Aliyah?

We can ask ourselves: how will our Jewish identity here in America change when the majority of Jews in the world will soon be in Israel?

We can ask ourselves: what am I doing positively to help Israel reach its greatest potential of being Jewish and democratic, reflecting the best of both sets of values?

We can ask ourselves: how do I teach my children the story of Israel in the way that their generation can hear it?

We can ask ourselves: how can we stay as one Jewish people despite our fissures and real and meaningful differences?

We can ask ourselves: how many resources do we dedicate to keeping alive the Jewish State, and how many resources do we dedicate to educating Jewishly here?

Passover doesn't need to be the only Jewish holiday of questions and stories. Let this 70th birthday be not only one of celebration – but also one of reflection. Let it be a day where we not only look up to Israel or look down at Israel, let it also be a day where we look inward at ourselves as well. Let us recognize that this significant birthday also affects us.

In reality, we can't really "manage time", but we can maximize the use of the time we have. Author and motivational speaker John C. Maxwell said it best, "Time management is an oxymoron. Time is beyond our control, and the clock keeps ticking regardless of how we lead our lives. Priority management is the answer to maximizing the time we have".

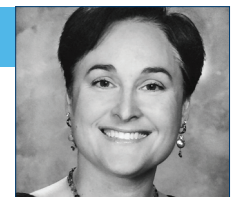

### Passover Reflections

Pesach is not only the time for dusting off our grandmother's china and the best of the family holiday recipes. It is not only the time to review the *mah nishtanah* and choose which haggadah you'll use for your seder. Pesach is a time for reflection about the relationships in our lives; at the very first Pesach, we as a people made a promise to ourselves and to each other as a community to stand together and enter into a relationship with none other than God.

We took a proverbial leap into the unknown when we smeared the blood of the Passover sacrifice on the inside of our doorposts that last night in Egypt. While we huddled in our homes that night, looking at the blood, hearing the losses of our Egyptian neighbors as the angel of death passed over our own homes, we began to under-

stand the power of our decision. We would live – and we would be under the protection of the one and only God.

As we traveled with God throughout the wilderness, we came to know ourselves and God better. We made mistakes. We strayed. We returned to God. We fought amongst ourselves, and we also made up. Ultimately, the story of our relationship is one of wonder, of knowledge, of trust and of growth. It all began, though, with the leap that each one of us took when we chose to leave Egypt – when we chose to leave the familiar.

May we each recognize our enslavement, and may we have the strength to make the leap into the unknown that will deepen our connection to each other, and perhaps, even to God.

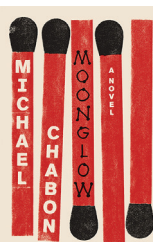
## Spring Installation Luncheon
