Annie and I met in Jerusalem during our junior year abroad while we were studying at the Hebrew University. It was a year after David Broza's album *Stolen Kiss* had been released, and the ballad "*Mitachat LaShamayim*" – "Under the Skies" was playing in every coffee shop, radio and apartment.

Six years later, when we were in Israel for part of my Rabbinical studies, a group of friends and I saw him at an outdoor theater in Rishon LeTzion. We took Annie's best friend from college, who is not Jewish, but visited us in Jerusalem while traveling. After the concert, our friend promptly started calling herself "Mrs. David Broza."

Since that concert, I have seen Broza in Ann Arbor, New York, Washington, DC and Jaffa. Each time he impresses me with his unending passion, his continued emotional creativ-

ity and artistic risk taking.

I hope that there are still tickets remaining when you read this article, so you can get a seat. David Broza is the Paul Simon, Bruce Springsteen or Neil Young of Israel. A virtuoso guitarist, with poetic lyrics that capture the spirit of the nation. His songs sing of unrequited love, of the quest for peace, of a nation yearning for better days, of beautiful women and of romance. He sings in Spanish, Hebrew and English.

We are in for a special treat, because he will also be joined by Ali Paris. Paris is a Palestinian musician whose family's roots are both Palestinian and Moroccan. He has traveled the world winning awards and playing in venues ranging from the Newport and Istanbul Jazz Festivals to the White House. The collaboration between Broza and Paris exemplifies the work of putting values into action and using music to bring peace in the world.

This concert will be able to help our synagogue do the vital work of making Judaism come alive for our community, and we will have the chance to experience the best of what great music can bring to the world: beauty, energy and hope.

Foundations for Jewish Living



It's getting to be that time of year again...Hanukkah! As a little girl I always loved Hanukkah for the presents, of course, but as an adult and a parent

I love it for a much more grown up reason. It is another opportunity to create new traditions to share with my husband, Scott and daughters, Orli and Raya.

A few years ago, I embarked on my journey of adult Jewish learning through the Florence Melton School of Adult Jewish Learning. I signed up for what would become the greatest

gift I could give to myself as a Jewish parent, "Foundations for Jewish Living". Each week we unpacked a different Jewish value. We began each lesson by reading and understanding its origin from the text of the Torah, went on to discuss commentaries on the text and finally engaged in lively discussions about the material and how to bring these values home to our young families. It was one of these discussions that sparked the idea of not just receiving gifts on Hanukkah, but giving them as well. One of the first traditions we have added is counting up the tzedakah the girls have collected through the year and taking them to the store to pick out items that they

want to give to other children who might not be receiving toys during the holiday season. Because of the incredible experience learned through Melton, my family has new traditions for Shabbat, Pesach, *Hachnasat Orchim* (welcoming guests) and many others.

How to Help Your Child Through Discipline

The top four challenges I hear Preschool parents talk about are food, sleeping, potty training and setting limits/discipline. It is my philosophy that children feel safest and most loved by well-defined, clear expectations. When parents do not set definite rules with their children, kids do not feel safe. They may think they want to be in control, but they do not have the life skills to control their lives.

At RFECEC the way we discipline is telling the children which behaviors we expect. For example: "walking feet" instead of "no running" or inside voices instead of "no screaming". Also, when children are really loud, it is amazing how quickly they get quiet when the adult speaks quietly. Of course there are times when telling

children the behavior you expect does not work, and then we resort to "Sit and watch how the other children play gently with their friends". Some may call this "time out", but in most cases we want the children to see other children appropriately playing and having fun.

When children have a temper tantrum, it can be handled two ways. Put them in their rooms and tell them you do not want to be with them while they are out of control, and when they regain control they can re-join the family. Remember to let them know how happy you are to be with them when they are back in control. Or, if you have a child who is having a lot of temper tantrums you may want to try a "feel better area". This is a soft

area with either a bean bag chair or soft chair, soft pillows, a soft blanket, sensory balls such as koosh balls and nubby balls, stuffed animals and cotton balls. Masking tape balls or bubble wrap are also good to have in this area. When your child is getting upset you can suggest they go to the "feel better area" to sit and cuddle and calm themselves down.

If your child really needs to throw something, have a snow ball fight with cotton balls, nerf balls, large pompoms with targets to throw at or containers to throw into.

By finding positive outlets for potentially negative behavior, you are teaching your child how to behave in a socially acceptable way, and they will be happier little people!

Reflections from the Hazzan



This summer I turn nine years old. I'm at sleepaway camp for the first time in my life. I'm excited, but I'm incredibly nervous. Will the other kids like me? I've never been in a place with so many Jews – will I be the same as everyone else? I'm so used to being different, the only Jewish kid, the only kid who keeps kosher. The only. The only.

My first love is music. I sing to myself ALL the time. Will there be music at camp?

On the first day of camp, we meet for *degel* (the flag raising ceremony), and then go to *t'fillah* (prayers). I can totally do this. The counselors are kind and friendly. I'm okay here. Shy, but okay. Breakfast and the morning *pe'ulot* (activities) all go fine. I'm not so good at sports, but I'm having fun. And now we head up to the *chadar ochel* (dining hall) for lunch. The food

is okay - what's going on now? They're handing out books, a counselor is in the middle of the room with a guitar - and we start singing! I LOVE CAMP!

In the afternoon, we choose *chugim* (special interest groups) that we'll have for the session, and I choose *makelah* (choir). We are going to prepare three mini concerts for the session - two for before Shabbat, and one for *shirah shketah*, (the singing of quiet songs) before Havdalah. The first song I learn is *Yihyeh Tov*, by David Broza. The words are haunting, and the melody is hopeful, reflecting my nine-year-old impression of the world; peace seems so far-off, no one seems to have good answers to the problems we face as a nation, and I often feel powerless and lost. I long for someone to simply hold my hand as together we navigate the broken places with hope for the future. Broza's words are a prayer, and I memorize them quickly. For the rest of my life, this song is

my comfort. This is the song I sing when I want to provide someone else a window into my soul.

David Broza will be visiting us to teach us about his music and his work for peace on December 10. I hope you will come meet him on Shabbat and return to hear his music at the Saturday night concert. I look forward to seeing you there - I'll be the one with her head in the clouds, feet not touching the ground.

Camp and Israel Scholarship Information

Rabbi Gershon Hadas Guardian Society Scholarship Program

The Hadas scholarship program is a community fund sponsored by the Jewish Federation and is available to the Jewish children of Greater Kansas City. For many years, this scholarship program has enabled hundreds of young people to participate in Jewish enrichment summer programs, including camps and Israel programs. In addition to scholarships for regular summer camp attendees, funding is available for:

First Time Campers Fund “Incentive Grants.”

First Time Camper “incentive grants” are provided on a first-come-first-serve basis. In order to qualify for a First Time Campers Fund incentive grant of \$1,000, the student must live in the Greater Kansas City area and attend

an approved Jewish camp program of at least three weeks in duration. Beginning this year, if the camp program is less than three weeks, students will receive a \$500 grant.

Long Term Israel Program “Incentive Grants.”

Thanks to a generous bequest from the Louis Family Memorial Fund, the Guardian Society assists individuals who wish to participate in long term Israel programs after high school or college.

Sugar Cookies

Ingredients:

- 1 cup sugar
- 1/4 cup (1/2 stick) butter or margarine, softened
- 1/4 cup shortening
- 1 tsp. vanilla
- 1 egg
- 2 2/3 cups all-purpose flour
- 1/2 cup sour cream
- 1 tsp. baking powder
- 1/2 tsp. baking soda
- 1/2 tsp. salt
- 1/4 tsp. ground nutmeg (optional)

Directions:

Preheat oven to 425°. Mix sugar, margarine, shortening, vanilla, and eggs in large bowl. Stir in remaining ingredients. Divide dough into 3 parts. Roll each part 1/4 inch thick on a lightly floured surface.

Cut dough with cookie cutters, place on an ungreased cookie sheet. Bake 6-8 minutes or until no indentation remains when touched. Remove from cookie sheet to cool. Add icing or paint the cookies. (Makes about 4 1/2 dozen cookies). **Hanukkah cookie cutters may be purchased in the Sisterhood Gift Shop.**

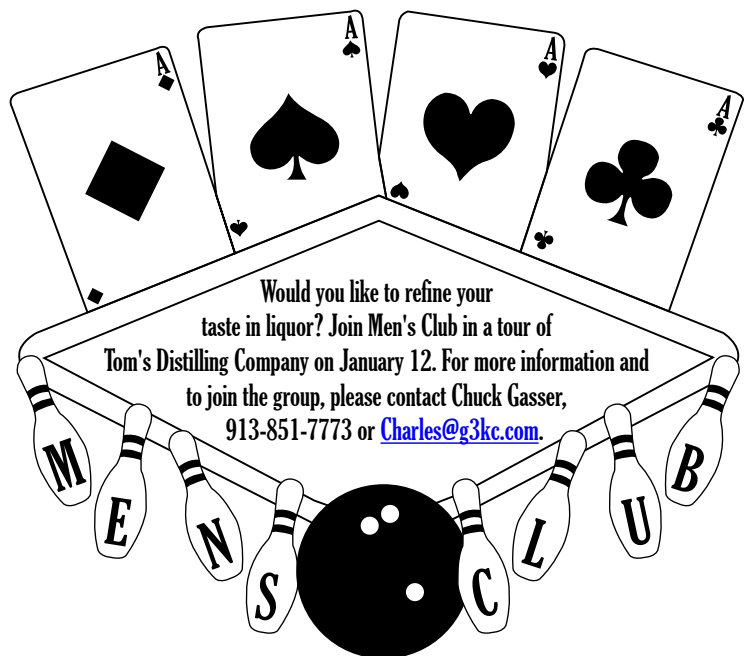

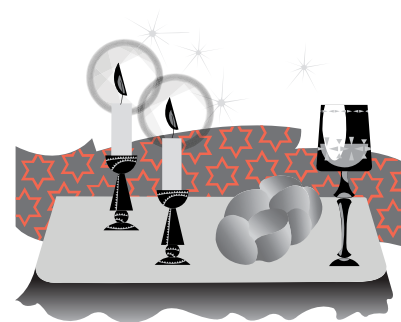

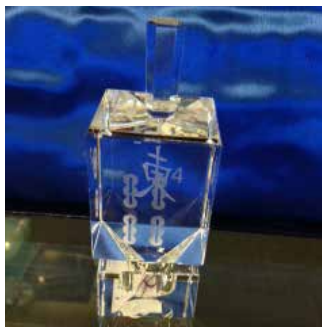
