

Yukon Chapel Renovation

The Yukon Chapel at Mt. Carmel cemetery has served the needs of Beth Shalom's members since it was built in the mid 1970's. The building hasn't been renovated since it was constructed and is certainly showing its age. In addition to a dated appearance, the air quality has become musty and the restrooms unsightly.

The structure, which is fundamentally still in good shape, will now receive a much needed overhaul from top to bottom. Through the efforts of cemetery committee chairman, David Sosland and volunteers, Marcia and Steve Karbank, the Sosland and Karbank families have stepped forward to fund this approximately \$370,000 project.

Improvements will include new lighting, flooring and upgraded ADA accessible restrooms. The original wooden pews and lectern will be refinished and new audio/visual equipment installed. New sinks will be located both outside the chapel and in the foyer for ritual washing.

In addition to renovating the chapel, the maintenance shed used by Mt. Carmel's two deeply appreciated employees, Jim Jones and Bob Pratt, will be replaced later in the summer. Construction on the chapel began June 6 and will take roughly 12 weeks to complete. It will not be available for use during this period. A dedication of the newly renovated chapel will take place later this year.



From the Rabbi's Study

"E Pluribus Unum": A Jewish Value



The motto of the United States of America, which is found on all of our money, is "E Pluribus Unum". It is Latin for "Out of Many: One."

In the past century and a half, it has come to recognize the multiple countries of origin from which Americans hail, the multiple faiths, the multiple ethnicities - and yet we are united under the flag of the USA.

"E Pluribus Unum" was the official motto of our nation until "One Nation Under God" was adopted in 1956 by Congress. It is still found on all of the places that contain the Great Seal of the United States of America.

Last year, I wrote about how the Fourth of July should be a Jewish

holiday, and I received so many positive comments that I am going to be using my annual July column in *The Scroll* to explore shared values between Judaism and America.

One of the unique aspects of being part of the Jewish community is being part of both small communities and larger communities. Here in Kansas City, we are members of CBS, but we are also part of the overall Jewish community. These small and large circles both contract and expand. We are members of a family, and we are members of B'nai Yisrael - the Jewish People, the Children of Israel.

Similarly, in the desert when we marched from slavery to freedom, we each marched under the flag of our tribe. When we encamped throughout the wilderness, surrounding the Tabernacle, we encamped under

our tribal flag. However, our mission was not a tribal mission, and our destination was not a tribal destination - we were part of the Nation of Israel, and we were moving toward the Land of Israel. However, tribes and subtribes give one a sense of belonging, where national identity gives one a sense of global purpose.

The same is true in America. The building blocks of community - family, neighborhood, school, city - are what gives meaning to our lives. But, as we think about liberty in the world - this mission comes from our national mission, not simply a local one. Wishing everyone a very happy Independence Day - one of my favorite Jewish holidays.

Disturbing Rise in School Bullying as a Result of the Primaries

The work of our Sisterhood's Bullying Behavior Project has become all the more vital in view of the results of a recent survey conducted by Teaching Tolerance.

Approximately 2000 K-12 teachers responded nationwide with 5000 comments. The results indicate a high level of fear and anxiety among students.

- More than two-thirds of the teachers reported that students expressed fear about what might happen to them and their families after the election.
- More than half have seen a rise in uncivil political discourse.
- More than one-third have observed an increase in anti-Muslim or anti-

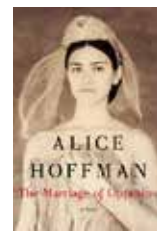
immigrant sentiment.

- More than 40 percent are hesitant to teach about the election.

The report indicates that in just a few months the strides that have been made in decreasing bullying behavior have been undone by the bullying children observed during the primary. Numerous teachers reported that observing what some of their K-12 students are going through is "heartbreaking". To download the full report, visit splcenter.org.

Lemon Pepper Baked Cod

Ingredients:

- 1 tablespoon coconut oil
- 2 pieces of cod
- 1 pinch sea salt and pepper
- ½ cup crushed salted crackers
- 1 whole lemon
- 1 tablespoon capers
- 1 tablespoon cilantro



Directions:

Preheat oven to 400°F.

Brush coconut oil on the fish. Sprinkle with salt and pepper. Cover the fish evenly with crushed crackers (to crush crackers, put them in a resealable bag and crush with the back of a large metal spoon or ice cream scooper). Squeeze the juice from a half lemon over the fish. Cut other half of the lemon and place lemon slices on the fish for moisture and flavor. Spread capers over and around the fish. Bake for 20 minutes or until crackers start to turn golden brown. Garnish with fresh cilantro and serve over a bed of rice or vegetables.

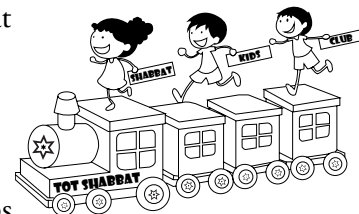
