From the Rabbi's Study

Jerusalem: Embrace the Complexities



This month on the English calendar (and at the end of May on the Hebrew calendar), we commemorate the fiftieth anniversary of the reunification of

Jerusalem during the Six-Day War. My column is based on remarks that I made on Shabbat *Behar-B'hukotai* on the Shabbat before *Yom Yerushalayim* (the day on the Hebrew calendar that commemorates *Yom Yerushalayim* this year falls right after Parashat *Behar-B'hukotai*.) This is interesting since the Torah portion gives us the laws about the Jubilee year, and this year is the Jubilee year since the Israeli victory of the 1967 Six-Day War.

For many in our congregation it may be hard to believe, but for those who are under 55, there is simply no recollection of the anxiety that was felt in the months leading up to the Six-Day war. I am forty-four, and for my contemporaries, we have never known a time when Israel did not rule over Gaza and the West Bank/Judea and Samaria. For those who are younger than thirty-five, they have never known of a time before the Intafada. For those who are younger than twenty-five, they have never

known Israel before the stalled peace process of Oslo.

There are many excellent books written about the significance of 1967. Ambassador Michael Oren wrote *Six Days of War*, a more progressive (and some would say revisionist history) is Tom Segev's *1967*. A more recent book is the excellent, *Like Dreamers* by Yossi Klein HaLevi which traces the life of the paratroopers who liberated the Western Wall.

It is impossible to minimize the instant transformation of Israel that took place with this war. In the blink of an eye, Israel had political sovereignty over Judaism's holiest sites. Israel suddenly ruled over areas in Judea and Samaria where Jews had lived for millennia but were free of all Jews from 1948-1967. Also, with 1967, Israel suddenly had military jurisdiction over an entire population of Palestinian Arab people that still today are not citizens of Israel, not citizens of Jordan, and the Palestinian Authority is not a full political, sovereign state.

There are complexities upon complexities, and I do not know what an end game to the peace process with the Israelis and Palestinians will look like. Eternally, having military rule over millions of Palestinian

people does not seem to me to be a long-term, tenable status for Israel. Returning to a time when Jews don't have access to our own religious sites like the Tomb of Rachel, the Tomb of Jacob, the Tomb of the Patriarchs and the Western Wall is also not tenable.

We, as Jews who have chosen to live in the diaspora, cannot afford to put our heads in the sand. We cannot afford to ignore the incredible redemption, nor the incredible challenges that have come through these past fifty years. We cannot avoid the complexities, nor can we ignore the importance of Jerusalem.

Perhaps, though, there are ways to peace that have not been tried. Perhaps there are ways to allow this year to truly be a Jubilee. So, as a vision of hope, I turn to the words of the Torah portion leading up to *Yom Yerushalayim* with the prayer that this can be a Jubilee for Israelis, a Jubilee for Palestinians and a Jubilee for Jews throughout the world.

"You shall hallow the fiftieth year. You shall proclaim release throughout the land for all its inhabitants. It shall be a jubilee for you."
(Leviticus 25:10)

Executively Speaking

Performing a Special Mitzvah



For more than thirty years, I had lunch with my father once a week, usually on Friday. Typically, the conversation was men talk: sports, politics, business, family, etc. But there were memorable exceptions. Some years ago, I thanked him for some thing or other he had done for me, told him how much I appreciated him, and asked if there was anything I could do for him. I didn't really expect him to respond, but he immediately said I could say *Kaddish* for him. I didn't realize it at the time, but his request was really a gift to me.

As I write this article, I have less than three months left in *aveylut*, the

period of mourning lasting eleven months (less a day) after the death of a parent. In that time, I've attended morning services almost every day, at Village Shalom and elsewhere when I travel. It's not always easy to get out of the house a half hour earlier than I used to so that I can drive in the opposite direction of my office to go to *minyan*. But when I get to Village Shalom (or to Beth Shalom on Shabbat and Sunday morning), I am warmed by the faces I see. Some people are at *minyan* because they are also saying *Kaddish* and some because it's part of their daily practice, but many are there just to help make a *minyan*. We're taught that saying *Kaddish* for a loved one is a special

mitzvah because that person can't do anything for you in return. Surely the same is true for those who—just by their presence—enable me to recite this prayer. Each person present not only helps me fulfill the mitzvah, but also helps me heal from the loss of my dear father. When my wife Diane finished this process, she committed to attending one day a week. I expect to do the same.

So if you who don't need to say *Kaddish* for a loved one, one way to express gratitude for your good fortune is by attending *minyan*. Just go to bethshalomkc.org, click on the *minyanmaker* tab, and sign up. You'll be glad you did.

Morning Minyan at Village Shalom

A few years ago, we began keeping track of the Hebrew names of those who were called to the Torah at morning minyan at Village Shalom, so that should they return, we might respect them by calling them by their Hebrew names. On any given day, we may have 10-15 worshippers at morn-

ing minyan. Some are regulars, some are there for a *yahrtzeit*, some are actively fulfilling their year of mourning, and occasionally we have B'nai Mitzvah who are called to the Torah in the first fulfillment of the age of mitzvot. Recently we were pleased, and somewhat surprised, to recognize

that there are now more than 130 names on the list of those who have been called to the Torah. It appears that this small mitzvah is an important part of our congregational life for many more people than we realized. If it moves you to do so, you will be welcome to come and add your name to that growing list.
