“Tikkun Leil Shavuot”

Shavuot is the second of the three major festivals with both historical and agricultural significance (the other two are Passover and Sukkot). Agriculturally, it commemorates the time when the first fruits were harvested and brought to the Temple and is also known as the Festival of the First Fruits. Historically, it celebrates the giving of the Torah at Mount Sinai, or the Festival of the Giving of our Torah.

What is a “Tikkun Leil Shavuot”? Mystical traditions created a ritual of all-night Torah study called a “Tikkun Leil Shavuot”. At CBS, we will study, discuss and sing late into the night with other congregants and friends and also partake of food.

Tuesday we will begin the program at 8:15 pm with Ma'ariv and the lighting of candles, followed by a series of 45-minute learning opportunities. Our theme will be Tikkun Leil Shavuot - “I am a stranger and a resident: Judaism’s views on insiders and outsiders”. Food will be served multiple times during the evening. Members are invited to attend as much or as little of the evening’s program as they choose to attend. *Shiurim* (Breakout Sessions) will be lead by many different members of our community. Come and learn from and with your friends!

From the Rabbi's Study

Personal Spiritual Journeys



In the same way that coaches must still have a workout regimen and professors need to keep up their independent research, it is vital for clergy to continue on their own spiritual journeys.

As many of you know, last year I began a new five-year contract with CBS. Part of this included a three-month sabbatical. I will be taking this in various one-month increments for personal spiritual and intellectual re-growth. The first one will be this summer.

I will be helping on the Melton Trip to Spain the first week in June. Following the time in Spain with Melton, my family and I are going to be taking a personal family pilgrimage to Israel for nearly three weeks.

To say that Israel holds a special place in Annie's and my heart is an

understatement. We met and fell in love there as undergraduates. We lived there for a year when I was in rabbinical school. Both of us have been back multiple times for professional conferences, leading teen tours and going on the Hazon bike ride.

We will walk the paths of our matriarchs and patriarchs and ride on the new trains and highways of the most modern state. We will hike Israel's natural beauty and also see her challenges in daily life. We will eat and drink deeply – both metaphorically and gastronomically.

But, most importantly, it will be an opportunity to connect with our immediate family, the family of the Jewish people, the sanctity of the Land of Israel and the miracle of the modern State of Israel.

I am grateful to the Board of Directors for affording us this opportunity and so appreciative for the extra hard work that will be done by Hazzan Ben-Yehuda and the entire staff that will allow us to be away.

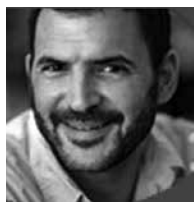

All Night Long

"Which is greater, study or action? Rabbi Tarfon answered, saying: Action is greater. Rabbi Akiva answered, saying: Study



is greater. All the rest agreed with Akiva that study is greater than action because it leads to action." - Babylonian Talmud, Kiddushin 40b

Shavuot, arriving on the evening of Tuesday, May 30, marks the giving of the Torah at Mount Sinai-and what better way to show that we are ready to receive it than to dive right in and study 'til the sun comes up, a practice known as *Tikkun Leil Shavuot* that dates back to the Kabbalists of

16th-century Tzfat. In the scope of Jewish history, that makes this a rather recent custom and, now in its third year, it's also become a new tradition at CBS.

This Shavuot, our *tikkun* will tackle a hot topic: "What does Judaism teach about our responsibility to the *Ger* - the stranger (the outsider, the foreigner, the immigrant) among us?" An exciting panel of teachers will explore this question through engaging texts from Jewish sources biblical and beyond, with an emphasis on how we can translate our study into action in the community. Of course, there will also be some delicious dairy delights - what worthy Jewish tradi-

tion isn't linked to food? - and other (adult) refreshments. (You will find more details on the CBS web site.)

As CBS continues to build a community of learning - the root of all ritual and action - the most important component is you. So even if pulling an all-night study session isn't something you've done since college, please consider joining us for a lively evening/night of community and conversation. Come for as much or as little of the program as you wish. Your participation will only enhance everyone's experience - and who knows? You might just make it to *Shacharit*.

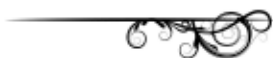

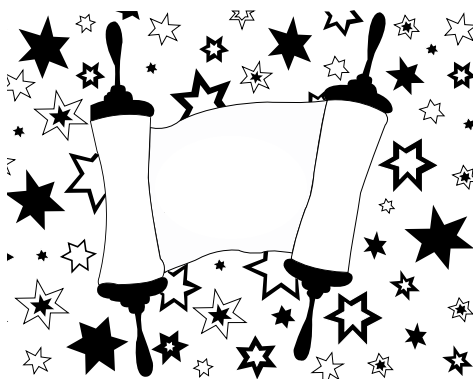
Final Talmud Jams of 2016-2017

It is so hard to believe another year has flown by. Watching the kids grow and change is such an amazing gift to me and the staff. The pre-schoolers are the fruit of our labor!

We started the year learning about the High Holidays and the fall holidays. Then the children watched larva hatch into caterpillars, spin their chrysalises and finally hatch into butterflies! They watched in awe as the butterflies drank nectar from their fingers and then flew away to freedom. We planted our fall garden and harvested and enjoyed our produce for snacks.

For Hanukkah every family brought a Hanukkiah, and we lit candles and watched them burn as we sang Hanukkah songs. During Tu B'Shevat the children enjoyed tasting various fruits from trees and then planted parsley to use when Passover arrived. At Passover the older children made Haggadot to bring to their *sederim* while all the kids made matzo covers, Elijah cups and seder plates to learn all the symbols of Pesach!

The Hazzan taught the PreK kids about salt water aquariums and living coral. A former preschool mom, Adi Shamir, came in often and made healthy smoothies for the kids. We sang with our music teacher Laura Payne weekly, and each week Rabbi Glickman told a different class a story.

We will end the year on May 18 with a picnic, bounce houses and kite flying. It has been a very fun, busy, happy wonderful year!

Counting of the Omer



From the second night of Passover till Shavuot, we observe the counting of the Omer, at the beginning and end of which, Biblical

Israel would bring a measure called an omer of barley to the Temple as an offering. They would count each day for 49 days, the 50th day being Shavuot. The time of the Omer was one where Israelites would be aware of the connection between Passover and Shavuot – between our exodus from Egyptian slavery and receiving the Torah from God at Mt. Sinai as a free people.

Not until Roman occupation did the Omer take on a more somber meaning and feeling. Since the

days of Rabbi Akiba and the Roman occupation of Israel that led to the destruction of the Second Temple, Omer customs include avoiding live musical performances, not getting married before Lag B'Omer and not shaving one's beard or cutting one's hair to show sorrow for the plague that occurred among Rabbi Akiba's students.

But the Omer can have a spiritual impact on us beyond the sense of sorrow over a plague some 2000 years ago! *Sefirat haOmer*, the Counting of the Omer begs us to look inward, to consider our spiritual state and to imagine the spiritual path we must plot and then tread in order to be ready to receive the Torah together again on Erev Shavuot. *Sefirat ha-*

Omer urges us to recognize those aspects of our deepest selves that we can improve, how we love/think of/treat ourselves, our closest families, our communities and our world. Those 49 days give us time to examine all of our spiritual facets in the hopes when we stand together at Sinai, we can be truly present, not just to God, but to each other and even to ourselves.

I hope that your *seders* have propelled you to consider your freedom and its purpose, and that during the *Sefirat haOmer*, you make the time to tend to your soul and prepare, as ancient Israel did, for Shavuot. I hope to see you here at shul at our *Tikkun Leil Shavuot*, our late-night Shavuot study session, on May 30-31!

Excerpt from Emma Shapiro's Presidential End of Year Letter:

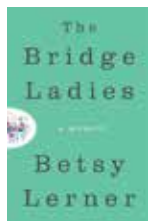

Bundt Pan Roast Chicken

Ingredients:

- 3 cloves garlic
- 2 carrots, chopped
- 1 onion, quartered
- 1/2 lb. yukon gold potatoes, quartered
- 1 large bunch fresh thyme
- 1 large bunch fresh rosemary
- Extra virgin olive oil
- 1 3-4 lb chicken, gizzards removed
- 1 lemon, sliced
- kosher salt
- Freshly ground black pepper

Instructions:

Preheat oven to 425° and cover the hole of the bundt pan with foil. In the bowl of a large bundt pan, combine garlic, carrots, onion, and potatoes. Toss with olive oil and season with salt and pepper.



Scatter sprigs of fresh thyme and rosemary on top of the vegetables. Pat the chicken dry with paper towels.

Season the inside of the cavity generously with salt and pepper, then stuff it with

the lemon halves, a few sprigs of thyme, and a few sprigs of rosemary. Rub the olive oil all over the skin of the chicken then season generously with salt and pepper.

Place the chicken in the middle of the bundt pan, breast side up. Bake until the chicken is cooked through and skin is golden, 1 hour to 1 hour 10 minutes.

Let chicken rest for at least 15 minutes before slicing. Serve with roasted vegetables and extra pan juices.
