From the Rabbi's Study

The Antidote to Anti-Semitism: Pro-Semitism



The media reports a dramatic rise in anti-Semitism on college campuses today. From California to Massachusetts, we have seen reports of anti-Semitism coming from neo-Nazi graffiti to slurs at anti-Israel rallies.

Instead of thinking about “combatting” anti-Semitism by teaching about its dangers, by always being on the lookout for racist comments, or by seeking the links between anti-Semitism on campus and the anti-Semitism in Europe, I suggest that we take a pro-Semitic approach.

Instead of teaching our teens and our college students why people hate Jews, let’s teach Jewish youth how to love other Jews, love others Jewishly, and love Judaism. Let’s teach our teens and young adults how to celebrate Judaism raucously.

Expecting our young people to “go to” Hillel or “go to” Chabad on campus is way too low a bar for our

incredible teens. Our teens are engaging in Jewish learning at our religious school and HBHA. Their energy has turned our high school youth group, KCUSY into one of the top chapters in the country. Did you know that our KCUSY chapter has had representatives on the regional board for at least sixteen years straight? Did you know that Beth Shalom teens are leaders in BBYO locally, regionally and internationally? Did you know that our teens attend summer programs and camp from every denomination on the religious spectrum? It is way too low a bar to think about our teens “going to” Jewish activities, or “going to” a synagogue or Federation event, as young adults.

Our job is to create a new generation of Jewish party planners, Jewish impromptu tour guides and Jewish justice crusaders. My vision: I want our teens to grow into the Jewish adults who “bring to” instead of “go to” Jewish celebrations.

David Cygielman, the founder and CEO of Moishe House recently wrote:

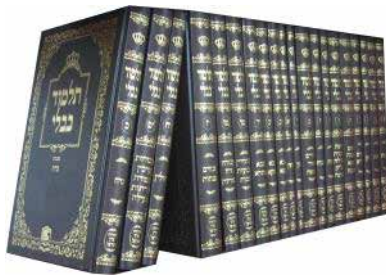
“There is a silver bullet and the data shows us it exists; however, the majority of us have been looking in the opposite direction. Watering down programs, coming up with catchy taglines, offering free food or paying big bucks for famous headliners is not the solution. The learning from our evaluation has illustrated that it takes two engaged young Jewish adults to reach one unengaged”.

Let’s make sure that the young adults who come from CBS are the ones who are reaching out to others. Let our young people grow up to be the out-reachers, the up-standers, the bring-inners. Our awesome young Semites are the best antidote to any anti-Semitism.

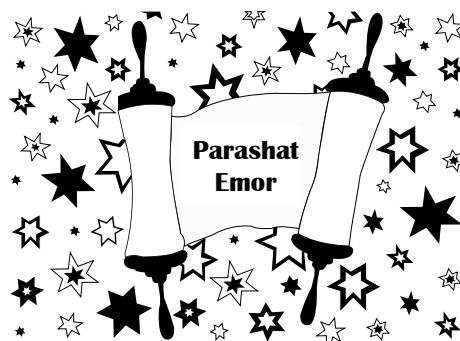
Downtown Talmud Jam, May 11

our feelings and mental health. After a full night of activities, we made cookies and pizza and "slept" in the youth lounge.

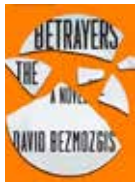

Sisterhood Open Board Meeting on Tuesday, May 17

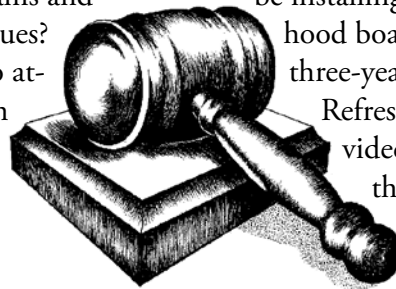

The Road to Judaism



The days between Pesach and Shavuot are a slow spiritual uphill hike called *sefirat ha'omer*, the counting of the *omer*.

In Biblical times, this was the period before the barley harvest. Later, Kabbalists would assign to each week a spiritual checklist. There are seven weeks, and seven different realms of God's essence that we contemplate during the *omer* to find Godliness in ourselves to help carry us from our new-found freedom to spiritual readiness to receive God's Torah.

The time between Bar or Bat Mitzvah and Confirmation is similar to *sefirat ha'omer*. Upon B'nai Mitz-

vah, children cease to be under the Jewish legal guidance and protection of parents; at 13, children gain Jewish independence. If a Jewish child under the age of 13 transgresses a mitzvah, the parents are to blame. It is certainly important for children to learn mitzvot, to prepare for the day when Jewish responsibility is upon them. But until the 13th birthday, children are not "free" (responsible) to observe the mitzvot on their own. Freedom for us today, just like it was in Moses' days, is not only *freedom from Pharaoh*, but also, freedom *to do mitzvot*.

The students who are being confirmed on May 21, however, have spent the last two years continuing

their Jewish education and the last year studying with Rabbi Glickman. They have struggled with the Jewish side of modern issues. They have come to know their clergy better, and they have strengthened lasting relationships. In a way, they have traveled from B'nai Mitzvah to this day, from new-found Jewish freedom to a place of readiness to better make those Jewish decisions that will shape their Jewish lives.

May all our students find and reflect Godliness within themselves as they encounter the world around them. Mazal tov to confirmands, B'nai Mitzvah and, of course, our graduates!

My Favorite Chocolate Chip Cookies

Ingredients:

- 1 cup salted Land o Lakes Butter
- $\frac{3}{4}$ cup of white sugar
- $\frac{3}{4}$ cup of brown sugar (pack down to measure)
- 2 eggs
- 1 tsp. vanilla (can add a little more)
- 1 $\frac{1}{4}$ cups flour
- 1 tsp. baking soda
- 1 pkg. chocolate chips

Directions:

Preheat oven to 375 degrees. Soften butter. Leave at room temperature for a couple of hours. Slowly add both the white sugar and the brown sugar.

In a separate bowl crack the eggs to make sure you do not get any shells in the mixture. Beat the eggs and add to the butter. Add the vanilla. Add baking soda to the flour and add to the mixture. Mix slowly until the flour is completely mixed in.

Remove the mixture from the bowl and add chocolate chips and drop mixture a teaspoon at a time onto cookie sheets. Bake at 375 for 9-10 minutes until light brown. Remove and place on a cooling rack. Enjoy!
