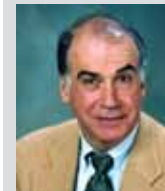

# From the Rabbi's Study



In Hebrew, when at a loss for words, we say "*Mah Omar, U'mah Adabber?*" – "What shall I say?"

As of the moment I write this, I have received over 100 supportive letters and phone calls from members of our Congregation expressing their sorrow at our leaving. We join you in that emotion.

I have loved Beth Shalom. And the truth pains me: but the right thing for us all is to grant Beth Shalom maximum flexibility in its rebuilding process at this time. Our congregation now needs to break down to its most solid underpinnings: its people. And then it must build upward from the beginning. No Rabbi can do that for you, and in fact a Rabbi can hinder that process.

When the challenges are as radical as what we have been forced to face, with so many years of deficit and the

unsolved problem of infrastructure, only growth from the roots will get the job done.

It is a time of uncertainty for us both, you and I, but also a time of opportunity.

I believe in Beth Shalom's future. I believe in its people. I believe in God, Torah and Israel, and that Conservative Judaism has a vibrant and profound role to play here in Kansas City. And I believe that my decision is for the best for all concerned. In time, the clarity of this moment will be seen as a necessary turning point towards a better future.

Thank you for your love and support as we each move forward towards God's best hopes for us.

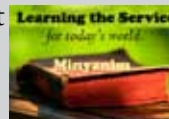

Since its inception, the group has participated in monthly events including social, community service, networking, Shabbat and other holiday related programs. Join us **Friday, January 28** at Wornall for an Erev Shabbat gathering.

# Executively Speaking

On Rosh HaShanah we focus on transformation and new beginnings, paying close attention to where we have been, where we are going, who we are and who we want to be. We will reach out to listen to you and learn what you need, want and expect from Beth Shalom and how we can engage and empower all of our members so that we may go from strength to strength.
