Elaine Levine

Elaine Levine has been chosen as the new Executive Director of CBS. Elaine states, "I am so happy to be part of this vibrant community."

Elaine has worked for over 20 years as a professional in Jewish communal settings, mostly in a synagogue environment. Her focus is working to make sure that the needs of the congregants are met, whether it is educational, cultural, social or financial.

She was educated in New York and received a degree in Early Childhood Education. After working as a preschool teacher, Elaine was offered the position of School Director

at a Jewish institution in Long Island, New York which she held until she moved south. While director, she was credited with writing kindergarten curriculum for state licensing. Shortly after moving to South Carolina, Elaine became the Executive Director of Synagogue Emanu-El of Charleston. Ordained as a hospital Chaplain in 1998, she served the Trident Hospital System of South Carolina as volunteer hospital clergy for two years. In 2001 she moved to Florida to become the Executive Director of Beth Ahm Israel, Cooper City, Florida. She is a member of NAASE, FASTA, and Past President of American Cancer Society.

Elaine is married to Terry Levine and is the mother of two adult daughters and one Persian cat named Tiki.

From the Rabbi's Study



Conversation Starters & Stoppers!

Recently, a congregant stopped me and asked how I would track our volunteer efforts. While I could not give him a definite answer (but I am working on it,) I was buoyed by the question. It was a very positive indication that we are headed in the right direction. In fact, if you

want to stop a conversation with me, just stress that we are in serious trouble and we are in risk of going bankrupt. While we have some major issues to confront, we are not on the verge of going “belly up”. Many claim that Jimmy Carter’s political demise began when he labeled our condition as a malaise. We know from our tradition that the 40 years of wandering in the wilderness was directly attributable to the 10 scouts who had so negative a view of themselves (they saw themselves as grasshoppers).

I have been heartened by the work of many people to make a difference. It begins with the officers and board and includes, among others, the Long Range Task Force and the Finance Committee which have demonstrated fiscal

responsibility. These are people committed to our positive future. They know that we must learn from the past, but cannot undo or change it. We are moving forward. Hilary Clinton’s book title emphasized that it takes a village to raise a child—it takes a congregation to make it happen. This is our village and these are our children.

So, back to that congregant’s question—while I could not answer it, I did thank him for stepping forward and I ask you to do the same. We are now in Elul. Part of our soul searching and personal inventory should be the determination of what we are going to do for Beth Shalom in 5772. It was another American President, John F. Kennedy, who reminded us to ask what we were going to do for our country. To paraphrase him, what are we going to do for our congregation!

When will Selichot take place

and where? The community-wide Selichot program and service will be held on **Saturday, September 24**, 8 pm, Congregation Beth Torah, 6100 W. 127th. For more information, please see the enclosed flyer.

Who is eligible to receive tickets for High Holy Day Services?

Membership in good standing includes a maximum of two adult tickets and entry for children age 24 or younger (College Students must present a Student I.D.) Membership in good standing means meeting the established dues payment policy, which includes 30 percent of the current year's dues being paid, and being up-to-date on any payment due on a payment plan. In addition, 25 percent of Polsky Religious School and Rose Family Early Childhood Education Center fees must be paid, and all other monetary obligations must have been met.

Where will I park? Parking is available throughout the Jewish Community Campus. Overflow parking will be available on the Sprint Campus in Parking Garage D, which backs up to the Campus and is close to the White Theater entrance. A map may be found on the back of your parking pass, which you will receive in the mail after September 14.

What about programming for youth, Kindergarten through 6th Grade?

Programming will be offered for this age group. No reservation is required. See the web or your packet for time and room locations.

Will there be babysitting for my children 1 month to Pre K?

Yes, with a reservation, babysitting is available. Please see the form on the web or in the informational packet. The earlybird deadline for reservations is September 12.

Who do I speak to about receiving a High Holy Day honor?

There are a limited number of honors for services. If you are interested in a High Holy Day honor for the White Theater or Social Hall service or for additional information, please contact Joy Koesten, jkoesten@gmail.com or complete the honors form which is available on the CBS website.

How do I order a Challah, Lulav & Etrog, or apply for Senior Transportation?

All of this information is on the web under the High Holy Day 5772 tab or in the informational packet you received. There are strict deadlines for these items, so please read carefully.

When, Where and What is Tashlikh?

Tashlikh will be held along with Minchah on **Thursday, September 29**, 4 pm, at the middle pond of Tomahawk Park, 114th and Tomahawk Creek Pky. Tashlikh is the beautiful, ancient Jewish custom of gathering beside a body of flowing water on the first day of Rosh HaShanah in order to symbolically "cast away" our sins into the water.

How do I sign up for the Sukkot Congregational Dinner held on Friday, October 14?

Please fill out the enclosed flyer and return it with your check by October 3rd to reserve your seat for this delicious dinner! Space is limited so get your reservations in early.

The evening will begin at 6 pm with a Minchah Service (T2K style and Traditional) followed by Kiddush in the Sukkah. Dinner will be held immediately following in Goldsmith Hall. See the enclosed flyer for details.

How do I obtain guest tickets? The form to apply for guest tickets is on the web or in your informational packet. Tickets are \$200 unless your guest meets the following special situations and exemptions for which tickets can be obtained free of charge: out-of-town guests, full-time students with student ID who are 26 or younger; military personnel with appropriate ID; members of other congregations who have submitted a letter from their home congregation stating they are members in good standing; and other situations as determined by our Membership Chairperson and the synagogue administration. Our tradition teaches us of the migration of the Jewish people through many temporary encampments, during which they grew in number and in spirituality. Many roles were assigned to portions of the people, including those who were responsible for moving the

components associated with worship. Some of the people were asked to lead, some complained, and some were lost. At each stage, God brought the people through to a new place on their journey where they made camp, celebrated, worshiped and lived their lives.

We live out that story in our contemporary lives as a congregation. We have new members, and while we have lost just a few families, we are not experiencing a "mass exodus" as we leave our encampment at Wornall. As I have had the privilege of serving the congregation through focusing on Ritual, I have seen firsthand how we have grown in our spirituality. The Board, Officers and Clergy continue to lead us with vision, sensitivity and by serving as role models.

Many participated in setting up our new place of worship at Lamar, which now invites us with a combination of majesty and warmth. And, the lighting and sound system work well, too! We joyously celebrated two B'nei Mitzvah and a wedding in August and will celebrate three additional B'nei Mitzvah in September. Daily minyan at Village Shalom has been attended by regulars and new participants, as well as by new mourners. We celebrate the smachot and life events of our congregation.

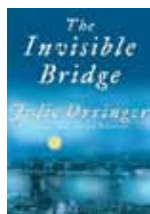
Fall Paid-Up Membership Luncheon
