From the Rabbi's Study

It's not an easy task to write my last *Scroll* article for Beth Shalom. What can I say to the community that welcomed me fresh from rabbinical school?

It is here in Kansas City, Overland Park, and suburbs between and beyond, that I first led rituals I had previously only witnessed or discussed. It is here that I had the opportunity to learn from a valuable and giving mentor, and work with caring and dedicated fellow staff members.

Many of you recently have approached me and expressed your views regarding how much I have grown as a rabbi since starting here in July, 2009. Sometimes it comes with a caveat that it is meant as a compliment, and not a criticism of my earlier skills. The caveat is not needed, though; I can feel the difference in confidence and comfort levels, and it is wonderful to know that you see it, too.

Kansas City, and Beth Shalom in particular, has a unique and vital Jewish community, with close-knit and loving families. I am sure I will find another Jewish community,

unique in its own way, also filled with loving families, in Australia. Greater Kansas City, though, will always remain a bright memory as my first synagogue and community as a rabbi.

Firsts are always special. The *shabbatot*, *chagim* and life cycle events that I shared with you will remain with me. Executively Speaking



From the United Synagogue of Conservative Judaism (2008): "The role of the synagogue in Jewish life is to motivate Conservative Jews to perform mitzvot encompassing ethical behavior, spirituality, Judaic learning, and ritual observance."

Through my recent participation on the Beth Shalom Long Range Planning Committee, I learned that a survey of members revealed

we care most about our synagogue serving as our spiritual center where we desire to participate at our level of ritual literacy. Fortunately, at Beth Shalom we deliver.

Most of us touch base with our spiritual home on Rosh HaShanah and Yom Kippur, when we provide both a traditional Conservative service and one with contemporary music. Many of us experience the spiritual revitalization of observing Shabbat in the synagogue, where again we offer a traditional Conservative service in

the main sanctuary and a lay led minyan in the library. In addition to Friday night services welcoming Shabbat, we scheduled ten Tefillah 2000 services this year.

While we will be experiencing a transition in our beloved clergy, Hazzan Menes will continue to send our worship heavenward, carried by his powerful *nusach*, and Rabbi Cohen plans to both lead and involve us in leading our worship, which the survey reveals we want. I learned that we want our B'nei Mitzvah youth to continue to lead portions of the service, to capitalize on their learning and to fulfill their new adult roles in our congregation. I see more young Torah readers, and I anticipate seeing more young people leading additional parts of the service.

So I conclude with a challenge: as a community, we will be responsive to the needs of our members. As individuals, let us identify for ourselves a "spiritual plan," and find the way to fulfill it through our responsive, evolving congregation.

What is an Interim Rabbi? *by Rabbi Alan L. Cohen*

Shalom, my name is Alan Cohen and I will be your Interim Rabbi for the coming year. I am coming to Beth Shalom after a long and varied rabbinic career that includes 36 years of congregational work and three more in the non-profit sector of Jewish communal service. Wait,

you say that you know all that already. In fact, you say that you have known us (all the Cohen family) for almost 22 years. I guess that is true but an introduction is still appropriate in spite of our long history—in fact, especially because of that long history.

Being the Interim means both of us (you and I) need to get reacquainted. Alan G. Gripe in “The Interim Pastor’s Manual” writes: “The term ‘*interim*’ . . . means a pastor (read rabbi) who serves for a limited period of time between two permanent pastors while the congregation . . . is conducting its work.” The key for both the congregants and the Interim is the agenda to be advanced is that of the congregation and not the rabbi.

Beth Shalom is re-envisioning itself and has already begun the process for the future under the able leadership of the Executive Board and the Long Range Planning Committee. Based upon that vision, the congregation

will be in a good position in the coming year to find the correct rabbinic match for its future. During that process, my role will not be as it previously was. Indeed, the entire staff will have to play a different role. Programs that emerge from that vision must be congregant driven—both the planning and the implementation. I am already deeply gratified by the number of congregants who have stepped forward to assist in these future endeavors. Everyone will need to play a role. The staff and I will not be the originators or planners but the resources and support system. My role in all of this will be to help give stability to both the staff and the congregation. I will do my best to provide the support necessary to implement this. I will also be there for the life cycle events of our congregation. I am excited about this new role and the opportunity to renew our deep connections.

So, we may know each other but since situations and people change, it is appropriate to reintroduce myself to you in this new role. Together, we will help move Beth Shalom forward to what she will become in the years ahead. Linda and I are excited as we plan to renew our relationship with our Beth Shalom family.

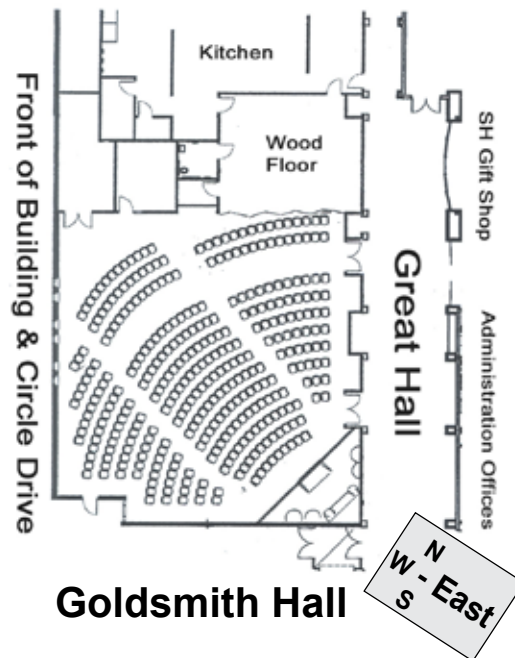


Transition Progress Update...



A New Bimah for the Lamar Campus

The Wornall Building Closure Committee and the Ritual Committee have joined forces to provide for a ritual space within Goldsmith Hall. We have obtained bids and plans to place our bimah from the Wornall Katz Chapel in the east corner of Goldsmith Hall (see diagram ). Included in the new bimah space will be the ark, bimah chairs and menorah. The maximum use of the space allows for a configuration consisting of 325 chairs. Since the chairs are not permanently placed, we will maintain much flexibility to be able to reconfigure the ritual space to adapt to our varied ritual needs along with other activities in the room.



Our plans are for the new bimah area to be completed in time for the first scheduled Shabbat services at **Lamar, Friday, July, 8**. As the Katz Chapel ark is being moved, daily minyan will continue to meet at Wornall in the Rosenblum Library.
