Purim Is A Time for Laughter!

When did we learn that Judaism is serious business? When did we become convinced that in order to draw closer to God we had to grimace and cry and cower? When did concentration on God come to mean a furrowed brow rather than a smile? At Sinai, we beheld God and we were afraid.

The Torah does not provide a model of levity for us. Rather, we are told that God is awesome and dangerous. Where is the laughter? Where is the joy? Count the number of times we dance for joy in the Tanakh. Not many.

Megillat Esther is different. It is humorous, ridiculous, impossible. It institutes a holiday which is joyful and playful. It is a reminder that the way to God is not a path of broken glass, but can be light and fun. Why not? Like

so much of our tradition, the kernel of truth has been surrounded by fences protecting us. Reverence for God has been extended to be reverence for everything religious, making play impossible, making lightness of heart an aberration. At some point, someone interpreted the *wait* for Mashiach as a *weight* for Mashiach, and Judaism became painfully heavy.

Throw off that weight! Purim is coming and it's time to remember that the world may not be what we think it is. It's time to laugh.

Ritual Committee Update

5772/2011 Rosh HaShanah and Yom Kippur services will take place at the Jewish Community Campus, allowing two simultaneous services and youth activities to accommodate the entire Beth Shalom community. While the Lamar building will be our ritual home, we recognize that we will need to provide alternate locations for events which exceed Lamar's capacity.


Arrangements are being finalized for options for B'nei Mitzvah which are estimated to exceed our capacity. These details will be shared first with B'nei Mitzvah families from August 2011 through July 2012.

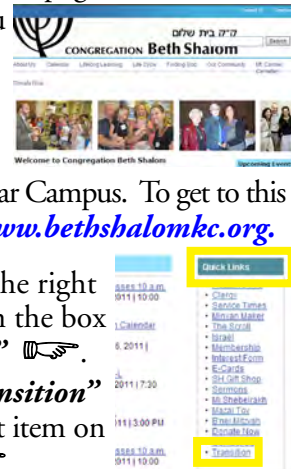

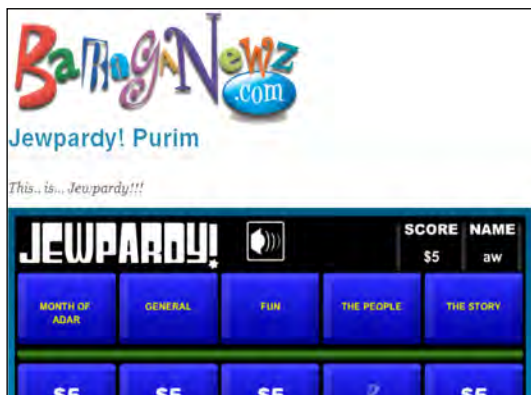
