100 students and adults will participate in organizing and making our carnival run smoothly. This event will include magical activities like booths, games, food, prizes, and the Kadima Raffle!

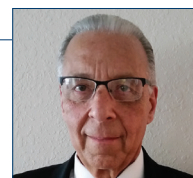

### Life Lesson 5: Almost Doesn't Count



The story of the Tortoise and the Hare is a wonderful children's tale, but it contains an important lesson for all of us. The hare was far ahead of the tortoise in the race for the finish line. He thought the race was won and took a nap just before crossing the line. While the hare slept, the tortoise passed him and crossed the finish line ahead of the hare.

The hare almost won the race. He believed he could not lose. The hare wasn't just confident; he was arrogant. It reminds me of an old Persian proverb that says, "Arrogance is the capital-stock of misfortune".

Danny Trevathan, a Denver Broncos linebacker intercepted a pass late in the game and had nothing but clear sailing to the end zone for his first NFL touchdown. Thinking he was over the goal line, he dropped the ball to celebrate. He almost had a touchdown. I guess he forgot you need to actually cross the goal line for the touchdown to count.

Less than four months ago, former Kansas City Chief Marcus Cooper grabbed the ball after his Chicago teammate blocked a kick. Marcus picked it up and ran 71 yards for what should have been his second NFL touchdown. But Marcus slowed down with ten yards to go to celebrate on the way in. He almost made it. Marcus' arrogance allowed the Steelers to catch him and knock the

ball out of his hands. That second touchdown was not to be.

Along life's highway, we will hit many detours we have no control over. We will fail to reach life's destination through no fault of our own. We may try other roads, but we finally give up. We begin to think there is no way for us to reach our goal, to reach success. All too often, we give up and exit life's highway one exit too early. We almost make it. We never know if success was waiting just down the road; maybe at the next exit.

If you wade into the water of a cold lake wanting to get to the other side, you're going to get very wet. If you get out because it's too cold, you will still be wet. Don't get out. Keep your eye on the distant shore and swim to the other side. You'll still be wet, but will have successfully reached your goal.

Concentrate on reaching your goal any way you can; leave the celebrating for the locker room.

## Partners In Chesed

“Chesed” is a Hebrew word which is best translated as “Lovingkindness.” It is a quality of God that we seek to emulate through providing kindness to others. Chesed is the core foundation of the mitzvot of burying the dead, comforting the mourner, providing for the bride and groom, and visiting the sick. Chesed is the theme for our learning in the two Talmud classes I teach each month (once monthly at Black and Veatch near the JCC campus, and once monthly at Lathrop and Gage near Crown Center).

I am pleased to welcome Rabbi Linda Steigman who will be helping Hazzan Ben-Yehuda and myself in some of the Chesed that we do week in and week out at Congregation Beth Shalom. She will be helping provide additional pastoral care for those who have been hospitalized, those who are in long-term care facilities and those who are homebound.

Rabbi Steigman is a member of the Rabbinic Association of Greater Kansas City and is an employee of Kansas City's Jewish Family Services. She will be helping our synagogue a few hours each week to provide better pastoral care to our members.

This wonderful service is made possible through a partnership with Congregation Beth Shalom, Jewish Family Services, The Jewish Federation of Greater Kansas City, and the Esther S. and William J. Bushman Beth Shalom Fund of the Kansas City Jewish Community

Foundation. I want to express my gratitude to these partnering organizations who are helping with this.

Rabbi Steigman comes to us with full training as a chaplain and is an experienced clinical social worker, and works closely with our community chaplain at JFS, Rabbi Jonathan Rudnick. Rabbi Rudnick also trains and administers the wonderful community “Spiritual Care Volunteers” that visit our congregants. I am also grateful for the time and energy that Beth Shalom members give to this program as well as our own Chesed Committee that visits people.

In the traditional *mi sheberach* prayer, we ask God for a full healing of the *nefesh* (spirit) along with the *guf* (body). Our hope is that through deeper connectedness to one another, we can increase the lovingkindness in our community and hasten the spiritual healing that takes place.

## What Purim Means to Me

When I was little, I was obsessed with the messiah. I was convinced that messiah would come during my lifetime – after all, hadn't we waited long enough, suffered enough, survived enough? Surely messiah was well on his way!

There were two things that worried me about messiah's coming – first, I was sure, by the age of five, that I was going to be a doctor. I despaired, however, when messiah came, I would be out of a job.

But I also worried about the Jewish people as a distinct and different group within all of the peoples of the world. Would there still be all the special and wonderful things about being Jewish that by five years old, I treasured and loved?

The story of Purim gives little girls and young women a role model in Esther, and teaches all of us that our fate is not necessarily sealed, even when it seems it may be – but we have to do something to turn the tide in our favor!

Abba explained to me that the only holidays we would observe are Hanukkah and Purim, since these holidays are holidays that celebrate national survival, where the Jewish people took it upon themselves because of their relationship with God to save themselves, to rescue and redeem themselves in God's name and with God's support – but with their chutzpah -- with their strategy!

Purim holds a special place in my heart, as it stands not only as a historical reminder of our survival in post-Biblical Persia, but it also stands as an early instance of personal and national resistance and self-reliance. It is one of the early stories of Jews being strong in the face of adversity.

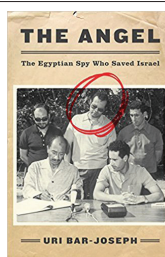

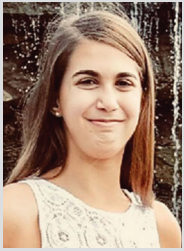
