One Woman's Opinion

"Teach Us To Number Our Days"

Psalm 90:12

We've entered the time of the year when we as Jews count.



We count the Omer, the great "count up" of 49 days from Passover until Shavuot.



We count from the celebration of freedom to the acceptance of responsibility.



We count from leaving servitude to Pharaoh to acceptance of service to God.



We count, the 40 days from leaving Mitzrayim, the straight and restricted life in Egypt until we stood at the foot of Mount Sinai as Moses ascended the mountain to accept the covenant.



We count, The Psalmist teaches, "Teach us to number our days, that we may attain a heart of wisdom", Psalm 90: 12.

You know the expression, "Some know the price of everything and the value of nothing." Maybe that's what the Bible is telling us; wisdom means understanding that numbers aren't a sufficient evaluation of worth. We have to match numbers with wisdom. If we lose our bearings, if we just count our numbers, we

will remain lost. Numbers count – but only if complemented by meaning.

Okay. Do I have your attention? Now for the hard part: Soon you're going to receive your annual dues statement folder. We will write to you explaining how much it will cost to be a member of Congregation Beth Shalom. Who looks forward to their annual dues bill and monthly statements? Yet, these are numbers with meaning. These are obligations with rewards attached to them. "Teach us to number our days that we may attain a heart of wisdom."

It costs considerable sums to keep the doors of Congregation Beth Shalom open 365 days a year. It is we, the members, who have to foot the bill. This is a bill which should be a privilege to pay. These numbers on our annual membership statements can provide meaning. These numbers can help endow our lives with purpose. These payments pay us back in manifold ways.

This year, let's try to open our annual dues statements with joy, not chagrin, with thanks for the opportunity to serve each other, God and Torah through our checkbooks, and with appreciation for the chance to attain more wisdom this year....

In addition to his rabbinic activities and busy home life, Rabbi Glickman is an avid reader enjoying a wide range of Jewish and secular titles. He also enjoys bike-riding and participated in the Hazon Israel ride from Tel-Aviv to Eilat three years ago.

He looks forward to his move to our community. “I



believe that today's Jews are looking for deeper meaning, more engagement, and the feeling of community,” Rabbi Glickman says. “I hope to build on the great foundation that CBS already has in this area.”

“I see Beth Shalom as a synagogue with a tremendous amount of potential” he emphasizes. “I am very impressed with the amount of volunteer involvement in so many aspects of the synagogue. I see a shul community that wants to get the most out of its synagogue.”

Tzedakah

Tzedakah is the mitzvah of using your resources to help others. Each time our students come to religious school, they bring money for Tzedakah which adds up to \$800 for the year. Our 8th grade students are responsible for distributing the money. They study texts about Tzedakah concerning why we give tzedakah, how much is proper to give and who is obligated to give tzedakah.

Students research organizations and make a presentation to other 8th grade students, including a recommendation of how much the organization should receive. The 8th grade students, as a "Tzedakah Board," determine which organizations, both Jewish and non-Jewish, local and national, receive money and how

much. This year, the 8th grade students allocated tzedakah money to Special Olympics, Safe Home, ReStart, Operation Breakthrough, Children's Center for the Visually Impaired, Heifer International, Chai Lifeline, and World Wildlife Foundation.

There is always a tzedakah box in the school office and we encourage our families to make tzedakah donations each time their children are in school and to make this an important part of their lives.

Patti is an invaluable resource for our students, parents and teachers, and we are honored that she is helping us to move forward. This is a great Challah recipe if you like your challah sweet and cake-like.



Directions:

1. In a large bowl, sprinkle yeast over barely warm water. Beat in honey, oil, 2 eggs, and salt. Add the flour one cup at a time, beating after each addition, graduating to kneading with hands as dough thickens. Knead until smooth and elastic and no longer sticky, adding flour as needed. Cover with a damp clean cloth and let rise for 1 1/2 hours or until dough has doubled in bulk.
2. Punch down the risen dough and turn out onto floured board. Divide in half and knead each half for five minutes or so, adding flour as needed to keep from getting sticky. Divide each half into thirds and roll into long snake about 1 1/2 inches in diameter. Pinch the ends of the three snakes together firmly and braid from middle. Either leave as braid or form into a round braided loaf by bringing ends together, curving braid into a circle, pinch ends together. Grease two baking trays and place finished braid or round on each. Cover with towel and let rise about one hour.
3. Preheat oven to 375 degrees F.
4. Beat the remaining egg and brush a generous amount over each braid. Sprinkle with poppy seeds if desired.
5. Bake at 375 degrees F for about 40 minutes. Bread should have a nice hollow sound when thumped on the bottom. Cool on a rack for at least one hour before slicing.

Ingredients:

- 2 1/2 cups warm water
- 1 tablespoon active dry yeast
- 1/2 cup honey
- 4 tablespoons vegetable oil
- 3 eggs
- 1 tablespoon salt
- 8 cups unbleached all-purpose flour
- 1 tablespoon poppy seeds (optional)
