Part of being human is making a mess. Whether by accident or design, we create disorder, spread dirt around and break things. We learn these skills as children, and we perfect them as adults. From the destruction of the World Trade Center on 9/11 to the BP oil spill in the Gulf of Mexico, we have shown our prowess in destruction. As Jews, we never forget the destruction of our Temple and the chaos inflicted on us by our dispersion.

But the days leading up to Rosh HaShanah are the days to remember how we rebuild. This is the time to clean up the mess. This is the time to create the plan to repair the world. This is the time to reflect and ask ourselves, if we were not to be written into the book of life for one more year, did we engage in business with integrity, did we fix times for studying Torah, did we fulfill the mitzvah of *p'ru ur'vu*? In short, did we create order and build a more peaceful, fertile world?

Judaism is a religion which places the individual in relation to God and community. We do not stand alone, and our obligations are not only to ourselves. So, when we engage in our *cheshbon hanefesh*, our accounting of our soul, we

need to look outward as well as inward. We need to consider our physical as well as our spiritual world, and our secular as well as our religious environment. When we consider *tikkun olam*, we must take in the totality of *haOlam*.

Rosh HaShanah is not a time to start over and begin again. Rather, it is the time to move ahead, mend the relationships, purify the environment and clarify the discourse. We are not starting from the void. We inherit the mess that we created last year, and it is our job to clean it up. It is not what we need to do before we begin the new year, it is the new year.

RFEC a High Quality Program

The National Institute of Health and Human Development began a study in 1991 that tracked more than 1,000 children from birth through age 15. The study suggests that "the quality of care early in life outside the home continues to affect children more than a decade afterward." Previous studies have found that children in high quality environments, including preschool and pre-kindergarten, gained an academic advantage compared with those in low-quality or no child care outside of the home. High quality care was defined as "an environment in which teachers are warm, engaged and sensitive to a child's needs and provide cognitive stimulation through activities that will promote language, such as reading, conversation and game-playing."

Given that a high quality preschool education is a requirement for your child, you may ask why a Jewish early childhood program is also a requirement. First and foremost, our preschool IS a high quality program that prepares our students for a lifetime of learning. Jewish values and concepts are practiced as well as taught. These include holiday and life cycle events, Torah and Israel. Our students form a Jewish identity and become a part of the local Jewish community as well as the world-wide Jewish community.

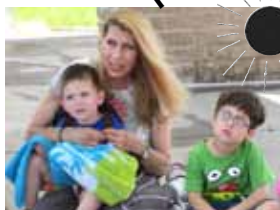

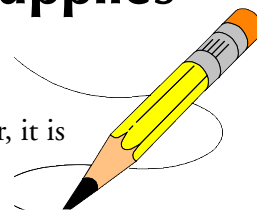

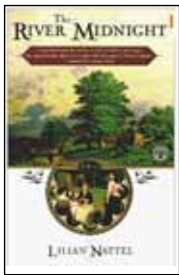
