***Maot Chittin, Funds for the Needy**

Traditionally, upon selling chametz before Pesach,
Jews donate to *Maot Chittin* “money for wheat”
a fund to help other Jewish families in need.
Rabbi Glickman will be administering the fund this year.

It is an ancient and widespread custom for the firstborn to fast on the day before Passover commemorating the miracle which spared them from the plague that struck down the Egyptian firstborn.

This fast is treated leniently.

Thus, if there is a festive meal that relates to a mitzvah (for example the completion of a tractate of the Talmud), the firstborn participates in the meal rather than fasting.

With this in mind—all Beth Shalom firstborn are invited to join us for services and a siyyum (celebration) as we complete a tractate of Talmud.
