What is a "Tikkun Leil Shavuot"? In the Torah, Shavuot, was exclusively an agricultural holiday. In the rabbinic period, our sages recognized Shavuot as the anniversary of the giving of the Torah at Mt. Sinai. The kabbalistic work, the Zohar, the mystics of Tzfat, and other mystical traditions created a ritual of all-night Torah study called a "Tikkun Leil Shavuot". Though this year we won't stay up ALL night, we will study and discuss late into the night with friends, discussion, singing, learning-and of course, food.

From the Rabbi's Study

The Challenge of Doing Without a Reward



We are in a spiritually interesting time of the year called “*Sefirat Ha-Omer*” - the Counting of the ‘Omer’. The Omer was the barley offering

based on the ordinance in the Torah to count the seven complete weeks from Passover to Shavuot. Every evening, the ritual for counting the Omer is to say the blessing “Blessed are You, *Adonai* our God, Ruler of the Universe, for making us holy and commanding us to count the Omer.”

Then, following the blessing, we count “Today is the X day of the Omer, which is Y weeks and Z days of the Omer.” That is the whole ritual: bless and then count. is not unusual to say a blessing before doing a *mitzvah* (a sacred commandment). We say a blessing before shaking the *lulav*, lighting candles, the *mitzvah* of eating

maror or *matzah* at the Passover Seder.

With the Omer counting, though, there is an unusual rule about the blessing. If you miss even one day of counting, you do not say the blessing. What is interesting, though, is that one is still obligated to count each day - but this time without the blessing. The idea of counting the Omer without a blessing made me think of all of the other *mitzvot* for which we do not say a blessing with *asher kidshanu b'mitzvotav* - “Blessed are You, *Adonai* our God, Ruler of the Universe, for making us holy and commanding us to...”

There is no blessing for giving *tzedakah*. There is no blessing for procreation. There is no blessing for welcoming guests into your home. There is no blessing for burying the dead. So, for me, the process of counting the Omer without a blessing was a

reminder of the uncomfortable teaching from *Pirkei Avot* 1:3:

“Do not be as slaves, who serve their master for the sake of reward. Rather, be as slaves who serve their master not for the sake of reward.”

I don't - as I'm sure you don't - like to think of myself as a slave to God. But I do like to think about what do I do (or what could I do...) in my spiritual life without any hope of external reward or blessing.

For these rituals: giving *tzedakah*, welcoming guests, procreating, burying the dead - and yes, even counting the Omer - being able to do the *mitzvah* at all is a reward, and perhaps I don't need an external blessing. What is necessary, though, is the mindfulness to be aware of the blessings that surround us - even if they don't start with “*Baruch Atah...*” *David M. Glickman*

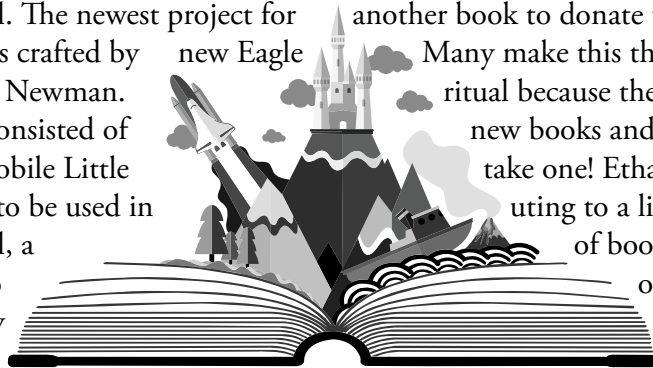


New Eagle Scout, Ethan Newman, putting the finishing touches on his project for our preschool.

Ingredients:

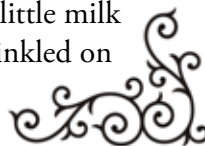
- 1 1/2 cups milk

Directions:

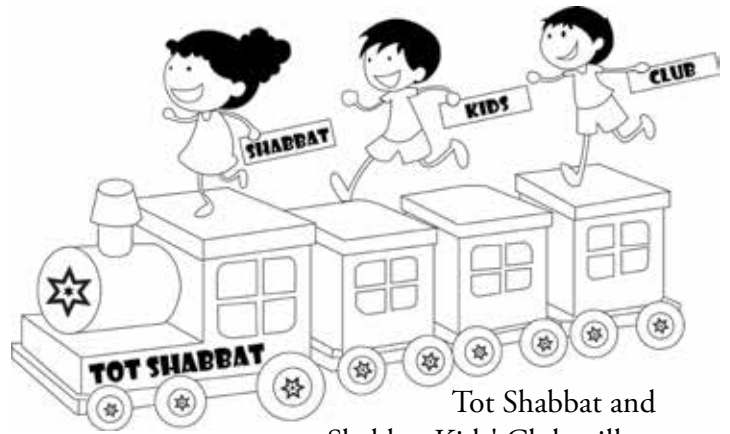
